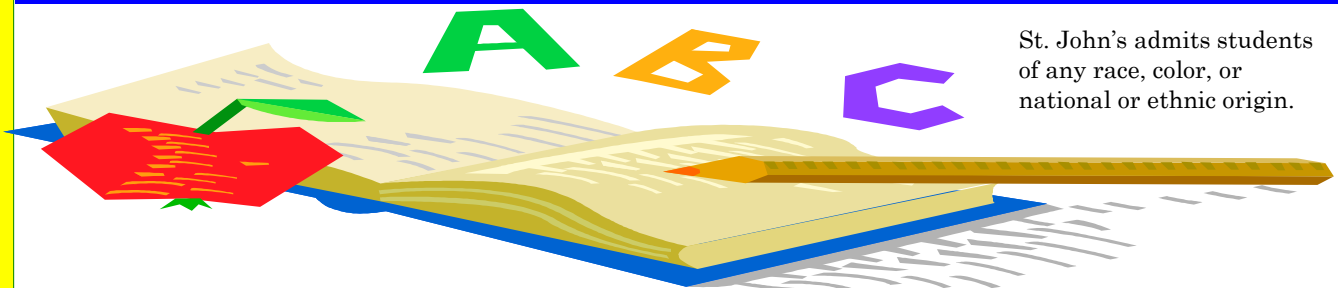

PRESCHOOL/PREKINDERGARTEN CURRICULUM

We proudly feature Voyages (LCMS) Lutheran based religion instruction across the curriculum and supplemental Letter People Phonics Curriculum.

Through playing, children learn by engaging in real actions involving tangible and concrete objects. Children increase their skills, creativity, and understanding by participating in activities organized to help them experience and make sense of the world around them. Activities are designed to simultaneously meet objectives in several areas of the curriculum.

- ◆ Religion: Students are led to grow in their faith through Bible stories, songs, and prayers.
- ◆ Language Arts: Students are immersed in children's literature, stories, speaking and listening experiences, and prewriting / pre-reading activities.
- ◆ Math: Students will develop math concepts within real life contexts involving number recognition, counting, sorting, classifying and forming patterns which build a foundation for problem solving and number sense.
- ◆ Science: Students will observe, predict, classify, and communicate.
- ◆ Social Studies: Students will learn about the role of the people in a family and community to help build self-esteem, responsibility and awareness of others.
- ◆ Music and Arts: Students will be offered experiences and opportunities for self expression.
- ◆ Motor Skills: Students experience free play in a planned environment to build proper gross and sensory motor development, movement exploration and games.
